Dear friends,

The next national event of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) takes place in Montreal from April 24 to 27. Survivors or former students of the Indian Residential Schools System run by the Canadian government and four Canadian churches will gather with their families and the wider Canadian community and tell their stories. These stories will be formally recorded by one of the TRC's three Commissioners in order to create a permanent historical record of this chapter in Canadian and church history.


KAIROS invites you to watch the testimony, pray, and take action.

Some people have been gathering in groups to watch testimony; others are listening individually. Either is an important gesture of respect towards the survivors and the truth they are sharing, as well as a contribution to a new relationship.

At Sunday, mid-week or special services, please include a praver for the survivors, their families and communities, and for all Canadians. Consider opening your faith community's space for an informal prayer service or ceremony during any or all of the hearing dates. The ecumenical prayer Remembering the Children is printed in this resource. Consider also reading and reflecting on the apologies to Indigenous peoples offered by a number of national churches and regional church bodies.





These courageous testimonies of peoples' experience in the schools are part of a shared history that has been built on a broken relationship. The TRC's journey is one step towards a new and healed relationship based on full respect for Indigenous peoples.

Whatever your background, please join in prayer or good thoughts for the survivors, their communities and their families, the Commissioners, and all who attend the hearings.

Statement of Apology - to former students of Indian Residential Schools

Excerpt of words spoken on June 11, 2008 by Prime Minister Stephen Harper:


.... To the approximately 80,000 living former students, and all family members and communities, the Government of Canada now recognizes that it was wrong to forcibly remove children from their homes and we apologize for having done this.

We now recognize that it was wrong to separate children from rich and vibrant cultures and traditions, that it created a void in many lives and communities, and we apologize for having done this. We now recognize that, in separating children from their families, we undermined the ability of many to adequately parent their own children and sowed the seeds for generations to follow, and we apologize for having done this.

We now recognize that, far too often, these institutions gave rise to abuse or neglect and were inadequately controlled, and we apologize for failing to protect you. Not only did you suffer these abuses as children, but as you became parents, you were powerless to protect your own children from suffering the same experience, and for this we are sorry.

The burden of this experience has been on your shoulders for far too long. The burden is properly ours as a Government, and as a country. There is no place in Canada for the attitudes that inspired the Indian Residential Schools system to ever prevail again. You have been working on recovering from this experience for a long time and in a very real sense, we are now joining you on this journey. The Government of Canada sincerely apologizes and asks the forgiveness of the Aboriginal peoples of this country for failing them so profoundly.
