ANGLICAN HEALING FUND INVITATION ONLY GRANT

The focus of the Mother Tongue Project is to facilitate the healing of hurt as experienced by speakers of Mother Tongue while they were children and youth at the Indian residential schools in Canada. Their families may participate in the healing process. Mother Tongue Project Grant is not an open application funding opportunity, but rather, it is a one-year by invitation only grant. The Anglican Healing Fund may specifically request for proposals to assist with the healing needs of communities and groups. The Anglican Healing Fund will give priority consideration for funding to northern, remote and isolated First Nations who did not benefit from the Anglican Church Settlement Agreement, who have a historic presence of the Anglican Church in their communities, and the Indian residential schools may be located in their homelands.

Process of the Invitation Only Grant

First Step. The Anglican Healing Fund will reach out to identified First Nations communities or groups to inform them of this funding opportunity, the criteria for priority funding consideration, and invite them to consider participation in this healing initiative. If the invitee is interested, then the invitee will be required to submit a one-page Letter of Interest stating his or her reason for consideration for this grant. The letter of interest will be submitted to the Anglican Healing Fund, 80 Hayden Street, Toronto, Ontario, Canada M4Y 3G2 no later than the due date specified by the Coordinator of the Healing Fund.

Second Step. If The Healing Fund approves your letter of interest, you will receive from the Coordinator of the Healing Fund an invitation to submit a full proposal. You are required to work collaboratively with the Coordinator on your proposal.

Grants. The amount of the grants awarded will depend on the availability of funds, and the socio-economic conditions of the northern and remote communities.
